American Arborvitae	Medium	20' - 30'	Also known as "Northern White Cedar", excellent choice for 1-row windbreaks	Fertile, adequate moisture
American Filbert (Hazelnut)	Fast	10' – 18'	Female flowers mature in summer into edible nuts that are eaten by wildlife. Fall color is beautiful and varied in color.	Adaptable
American Plum	Fast	10' - 30'	Thicket forming shrub, showy large white flowers, red plums, eaten by a variety of wildlife.	Adaptable
American Cranberry	Fast	10' - 12'	Clusters of white flowers in the Spring. Produces a profusion of red berries that persist through the Winter.	Adaptable
Black Oak	Slow-Medium	60-80'	Leaves turn deep orange or red in fall.	Tolerates poor dry sites
Blue Spruce	Slow-Medium	50' - 75'	A magnificent sight of silver blue-green spruce. Rated one of the most popular evergreens. It grows well while young.	Various
Butternut	Medium	40-70'	Also known as White Walnut, valuable for wildlife.	Adaptable
Ninebark	Fast	5-10'	Blooms for weeks in summer with cluster of white flowers. Seed clusters are enjoyed by birds in the fall. Exfoliating bark provides additional winter interest.	Adaptable
Northern Red Oak	Slow - Medium	60' - 80'	One of the fastest growing oaks. Valuable for wildlife. Hardy in city conditions. Endures cold.	Moist, well-drained
Norway Spruce	Medium	60' - 90'	Fastest growing spruce. Hardy, shade tolerant. High seed value for wildlife. Good choice for windbreaks.	Adaptable, moist
Old-Fashioned Lilac	Fast	12' - 15'	Fragrant lavender blooms that adorn this old fashioned classis shrub	Adaptable
Pecan	Medium	60-80'	Nuts are smaller than commercial varieties, but considered sweeter	Moist, drained
Red Osier Dogwood	Fast	10' - 15'	Attractive red stems with cream flowers followed by white berries. Good wildlife food and cover. Excellent for ornamental windbreaks & barriers	Moist
Red Maple	Medium - Fast	40' – 70'	One of the first trees to color in the fall in shades of bright yellow, flaming orange or red. Often planted as a urban shade tree.	Moist, well-drained
River Birch	Fast	40' -80'	Paper thin bark peels in winter, yellow fall foliage.	Moist/Wet
Shellbark Hickory	Slow	70-100'	Large tree with straight trunk & narrow rounded crown, and large leaves. Resembles Shagbark but much larger nut.	Moist to Wet
Swamp White Oak	Med-Fast	50-70'	Tolerant of high moisture, acorns eaten by a variety of wildlife species	Moist
Walnut	Fast	70' - 90'	Valuable hardwood, flavorful fruit.	Rich, moist well drained
White Oak	Slow - medium	60' - 80'	Not a fast starter as a seedling but growth rate picks up after 5 years or so.	Adaptable
White Pine	Medium - Fast	70' - 100'	Fast growing. Long, soft needles. Largest of the conifers	Adaptable; well drained upland
White Spruce	Medium	40' - 80'	Light bluish green needle, hardy, more deer resistant than other conifers	Moist; well drained
